Approval of income and expenditure statement:

Reflections from secretariat: Shaun Spiers (Executive Director, Green Alliance)

- Keeping net zero on track as a policy aim is vital, particularly in the context of Ukraine, cost of living squeeze, and pushback against net zero
- Farming reform: also vital to stay on track
- Need to see more focus on delivery across government departments, and better join-up, as there is a danger we get commitments without the means to achieve them
- Greening the important govt depts that aren't delivering (notably DIT & DHCLUC) will be key
- Environment Act enforcement is a priority: consultation on environmental targets, need to see high ambition and, crucially, delivery
